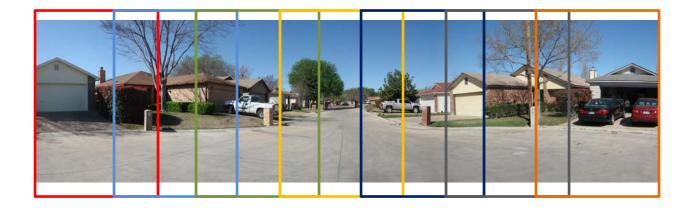
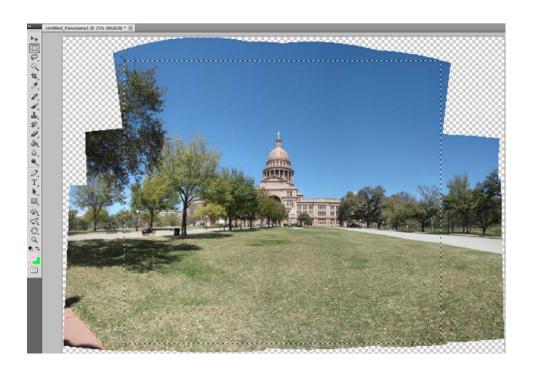
Adobe Photoshop Panorama Picture

Now that the iPhone 5 has an option for taking the panorama picture, you might wonder why this tutorial is necessary. Taking the panorama picture is a skill that can be expanded to include more than a single pass of the camera. Our pictures will be done with iPads or cameras we have in the classroom.

1. The most critical part of taking a panorama picture is making sure that you capture about 1/3 of the previous image in each photograph you take. Our panorama pictures will be made up of at least 7 individual shots. Here's how it's done.



- 2. In the photograph above, each colored square represents a different shot of the scene. Notice how they overlap one another. This is essential in order to have a successful panorama shot for Photoshop.
- 3. Once you have taken your pictures, transfer them over to one of the computers in the classroom. Save them in a folder inside your home directory (H: drive).
- 4. Open Adobe Photoshop. You do not need to create a new document.
- 5. From the File menu, select Automate / Photomerge.
- 6. Click the button labeled Browse and navigate to your photos. Select all of the photos for your project and click OK.
- 7. Once your pictures have loaded, click OK in the upper right corner of the dialog window.
- 8. When your photo has been merged, it will load in your Photoshop window. You can now use the Rectangular Marquee Tool, shown below, to draw a box around your image.



- 9. Crop your image to the selection by clicking Image / Crop.
- 10. Save your photo to your home folder (H: drive) with your name in the filename.
- 11. Copy the document to our class dropbox.
